



F. BLOYCE BULMAN

- Grew up in Riverview playing many different sports, including hockey and football at Riverview High School.
- Recruited by then football coach Doug Mitchell to the Mount Allison University Mounties as a Defensive End (1981).
- Three-time AUAA All-Star Defensive End (1982, 1984, 1985).
- Won back-to-back AUAA Football Championships with Mount Allison University (1984, 1985).
- Member of the Mount Allison University Atlantic Bowl Football Championship Team (1984).
- Played in the Vanier Cup (1984) as a member of the first Mount Allison University football team to advance to a national championship.
- Named to the All-Canadian Second Team Defensive (1984).
- Drafted to the Canadian Football League (CFL)'s Montreal team 40th overall in the 5th round (1985).
- One of five Mount Allison University football players who received an Achievement Award and New Brunswick Bi-Centennial Medal from Town of Riverview Mayor David Cudmore (1985).
- Honoured with the Key to the Town of Sackville by Mayor Will Campbell (1985).
- Named to the Mount Allison University 1984-1991 "Dream Team" by Coach John MacNeil.
- After university, Bloyce focused his energy on his family and running Stonehurst Camping and Golf, which he purchased with his brother Glenn in 1987.
- After his death in 2007, his friends and former teammates established the F. Bloyce Bulman Memorial Golf Tournament, which funds the annual Bloyce Bulman Memorial Scholarship. The scholarship is awarded to a graduating Riverview High School football player who demonstrates leadership on and off the field and intends to compete in football at the university level. To date, more than \$30,000 has been raised to support the scholarship in perpetuity.
