



JOYCE (DOUTHWRIGHT) SLIPP

- A Gunningsville native who attended Edith Cavell & Moncton High schools.
- A standout athlete in many sports.
- Attained her BPE and BA at UNB.
- With the UNB Athletics Program from 1968 until retirement in 2006.
- Student-athlete in field hockey and basketball.
- Colin B. Mackay Shield winner in 1974 as UNB's Female Athlete of the Year.
- Member of the Canadian National Women's Basketball Team 1969 – 1976.
- Participated in the World Women's Basketball Championship in 1970, the Pan-American Games in 1971, and was Canada's top scorer at the World Student Games in 1973.
- Captained the first ever Canadian Women's Olympic Team at the 1976 Montreal Olympics.
- 1977-1990 (with a brief hiatus in 1980-81) she was a lecturer in UNB's Faculty of Physical Education and Recreation, and head coach of either field hockey or basketball –coaching both for several years.
- 1990 became a Sport Consultant with the Province of New Brunswick.
- 1995 - Returned as head basketball coach of the Varsity Reds women, as well as UNB's Assistant Athletic Director.
- Led her basketball teams to 3 Atlantic Championships & her field hockey teams to 8 Atlantic Championships.
- 1986 & 1989 – CIS Field Hockey Coach of the Year.
- 1992 - The Joyce Slipp Field Hockey Rookie of the Year Award was named in her honour.
- 2006 - UNB hosted the CIS Women's Basketball Championships after which Joyce retired saying, "I've enjoyed it all - all the games, all the practices, all the athletes, everything about it. It was fun!"
- Joyce has been inducted into the Moncton Sports Wall of Fame, the Fredericton Sports Wall of Fame, the New Brunswick Sports Hall of Fame, the Canadian Olympic Hall of Fame, and the Canadian Basketball Hall of Fame.
- Since retirement, Joyce continues to be physically active, volunteers in the community & beyond.
- Joyce and husband Dick continue to live near Fredericton area. They have 2 children - Shanda (BSc, MD CCFP) & Tyler (BScCS), head coach of women's basketball at the U of Waterloo.
- Much of her time now involves 4 grandchildren – Alice, Payton, Wyatt, and Evelyn.
